14TH ANNUAL TRAINING INSTITUTE

Held in August 2024, this year, was the largest TI ever in Engage history! More than 230 advocates came to DC to learn how to raise their voices and hold their elected officials accountable in the fight for healthcare as a human right. Engagers spent the weekend with experts in TB response, legislation, social medicine, fundraising tactics, and so much more. Most importantly, they built community and solidarity with others who believe in the PIH mission.

With rare exceptions, all of your most important achievements on this planet will come from working with others—or, in a word, partnership.



We organize by building dedicated, well-resourced teams and by fostering alliances with groups who share our vision. We educate by hosting discussion groups and public lectures about the right to health. We advocate for global and domestic policies that further the right to health. We generate resources to fund high-quality health care for people living in poverty. Together, we demand the right to health be protected for all people, everywhere.

At PIH Engage, we believe that realizing the right to health requires **strategic** and **targeted political action**. To create change, we must pressure our elected officials to promote and codify justice-based health legislation.




TUBERCULOSIS HILL DAY IN APRIL

TB Hill Day takes place annually, and this year it was organized in partnership between PIH Advocacy, We Are TB, the TB Roundtable, and TB Fighters, an incredible collaboration of activists, survivors, and health care advocates. On April 9, the group gathered in front of the Capitol before heading to Congressional meetings.

OUR CAMPAIGN

Promoting and codifying the global right to health requires targeted political action towards congressional offices. Over the past year, our Engagers built relationships with 159 congressional offices by meeting with staffers, following up with their electeds, and cultivating connections that enabled them to hold their Members of Congress accountable to our asks. The 2024-25 campaign focused on organizing 1000+ advocacy actions network-wide to secure House and Senate co-sponsors for the End TB Now Act (S. 288/H.R. 1776).

SOLIDARITY IN ACTION

END TB NOW ACT

The End TB Now Act lays the foundation to make TB what it should have been long ago - a disease of the past. This bicameral, bipartisan legislation directs the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to set bold targets to reach and treat the most vulnerable populations for all forms of TB. This bill codifies the search, treat, and prevent method as standard care for tuberculosis globally and will be a framework for prioritizing TB during spring appropriation requests. The End TB Now Act builds on the values and goals of our 2023-24 advocacy campaign, the Paul Farmer Memorial Resolution (H.Res.204/S.Res.95) which prioritized economic justice reforms for a global right to health in part by investing in resources to fight TB. **Engagers directly garnered 13 new House co-sponsors for the bill**, and rallied renewed support in the Senate. Because of this momentum, the End TB Now Act was put up for a vote and **passed in the Senate on September 19, 2024!** However, it did not pass in the House before the end of the 118th Congress, so we have more work to do.


