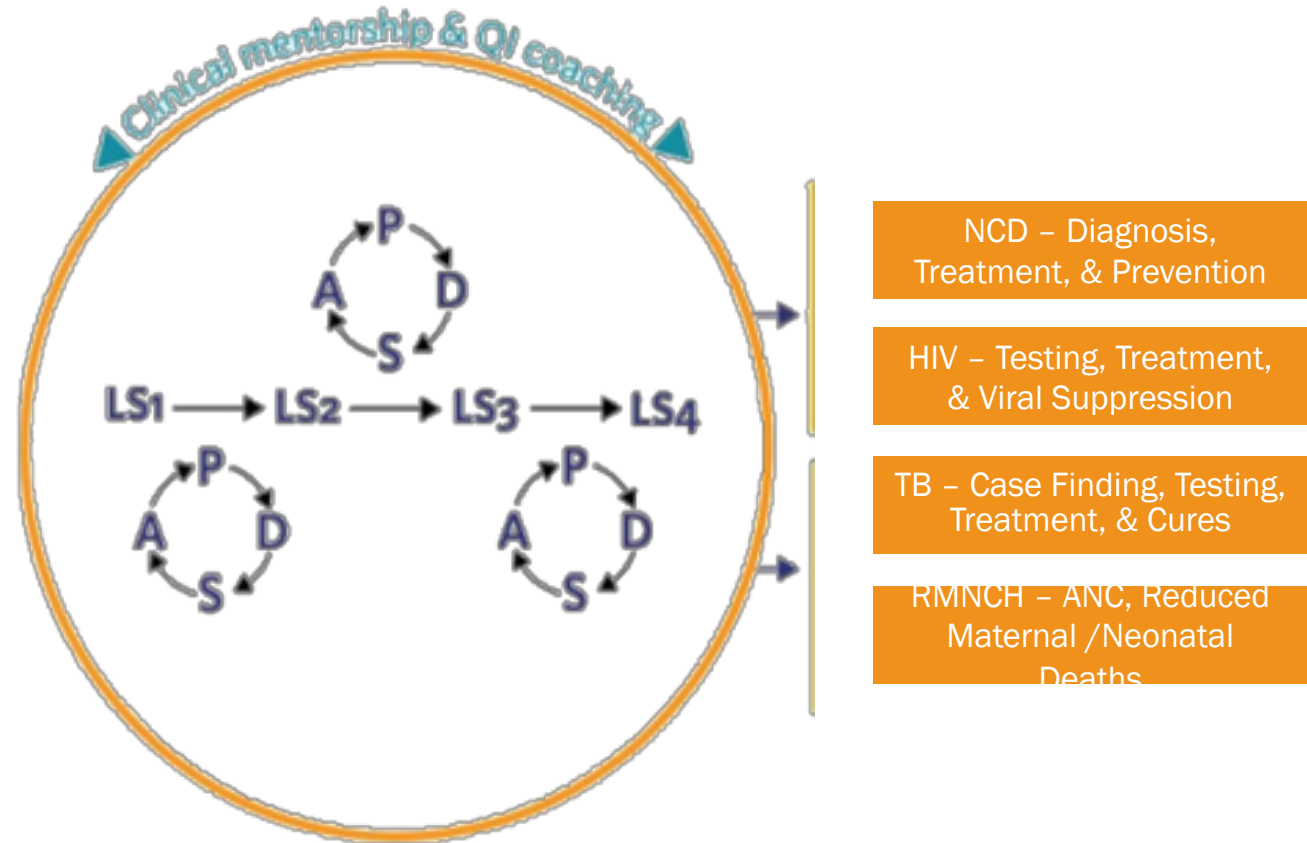

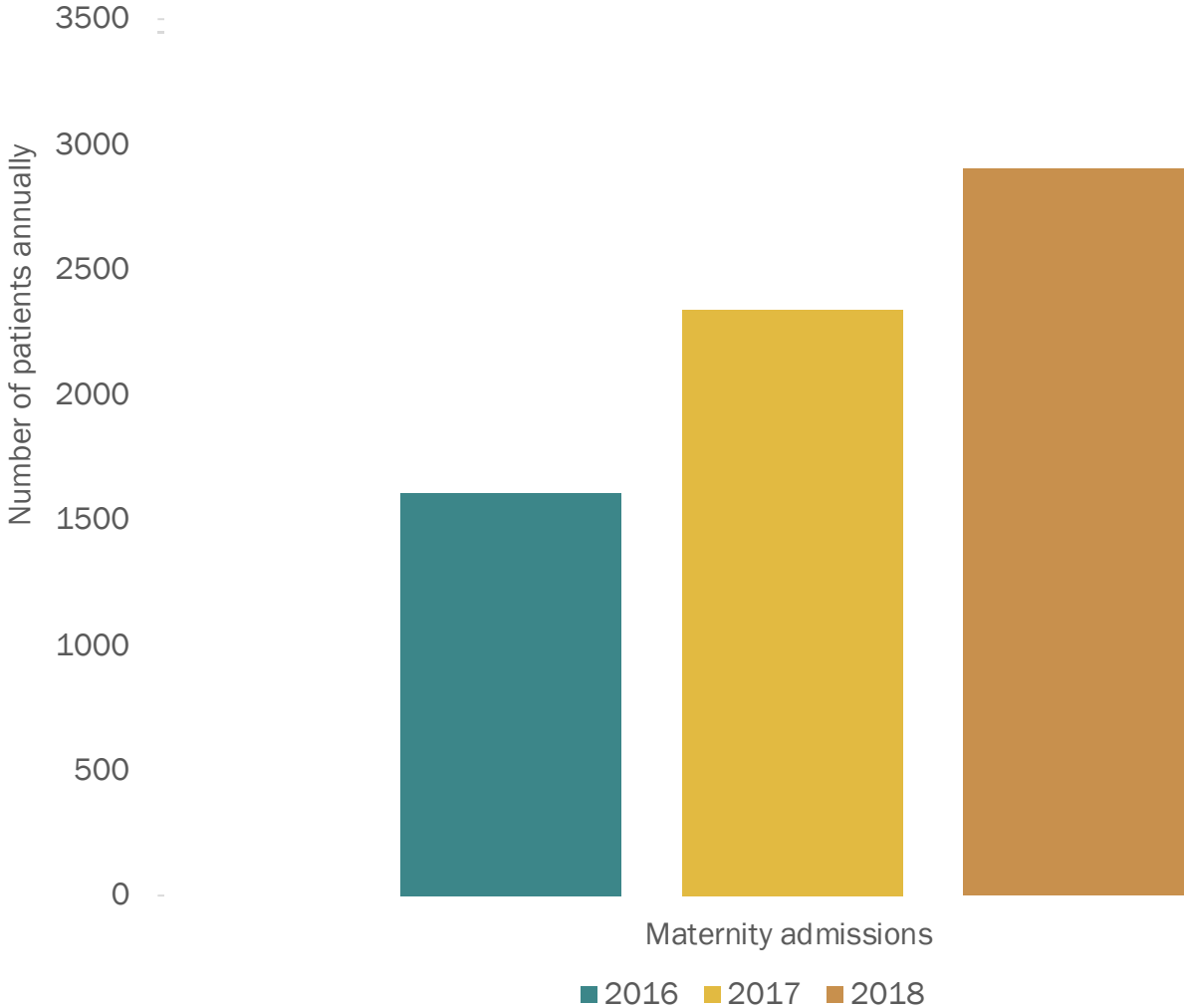

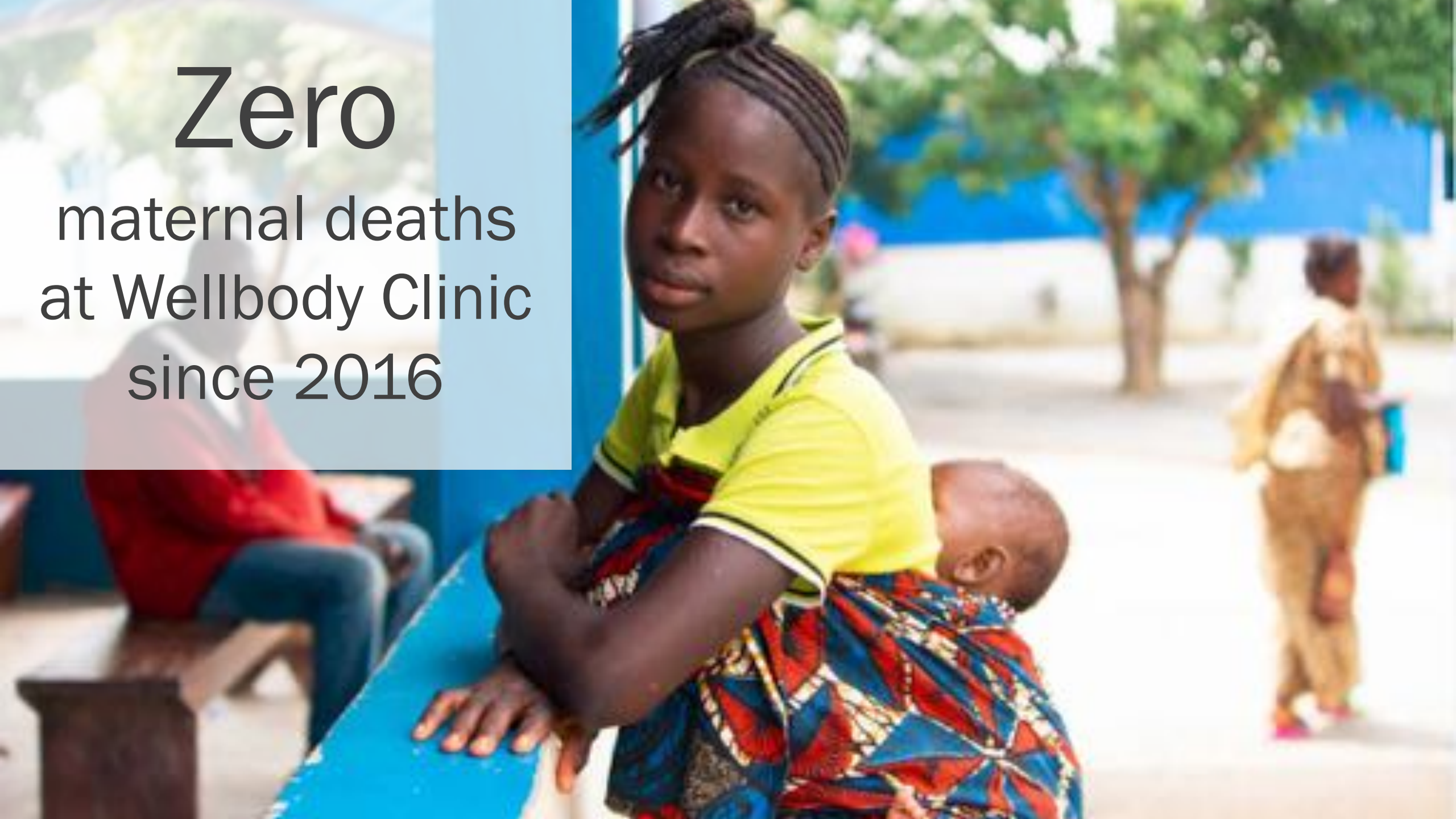
Maternal Health Care provided at PIH facilities over the past three years

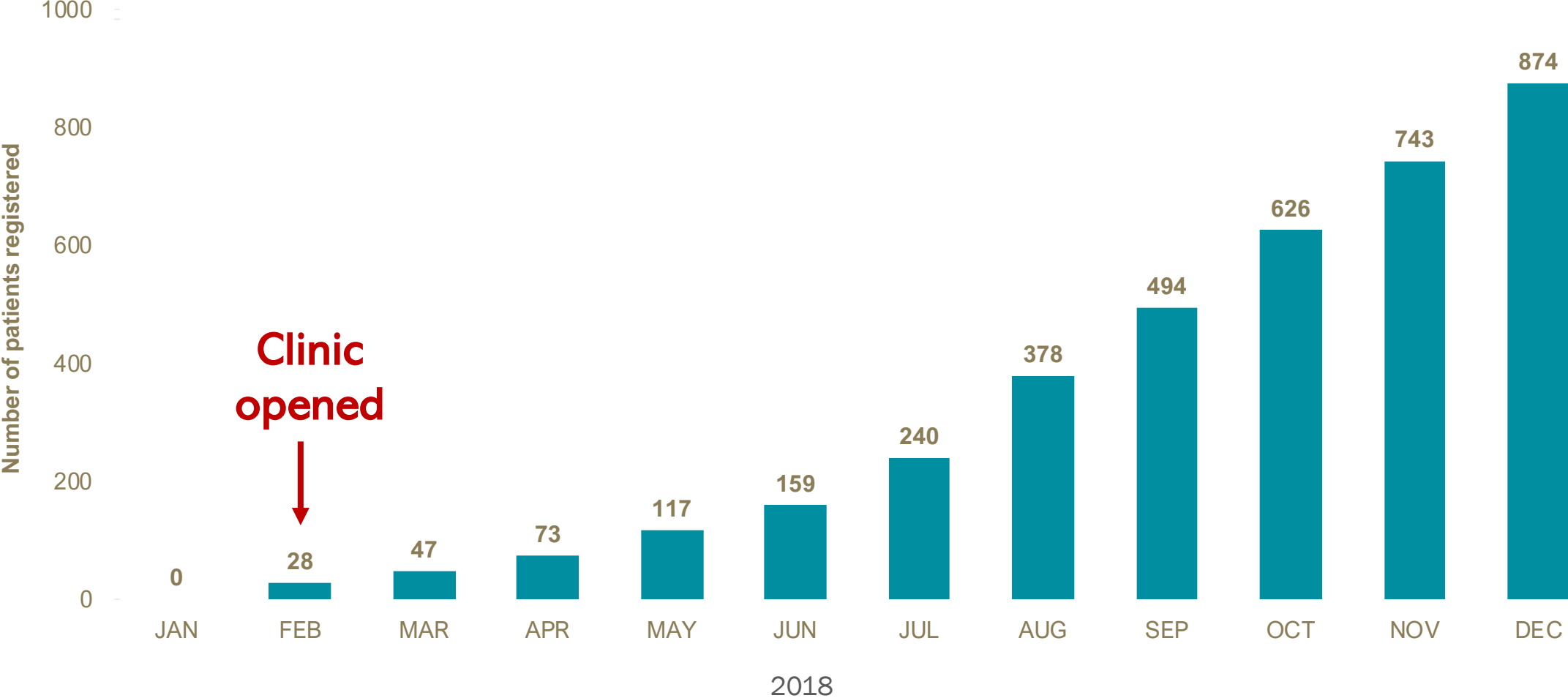


Five months later, Silyan gave the vote of thanks at the World TB Day celebration, thanking PIH and the fearless doctors from the Ministry of Health for saving her life.

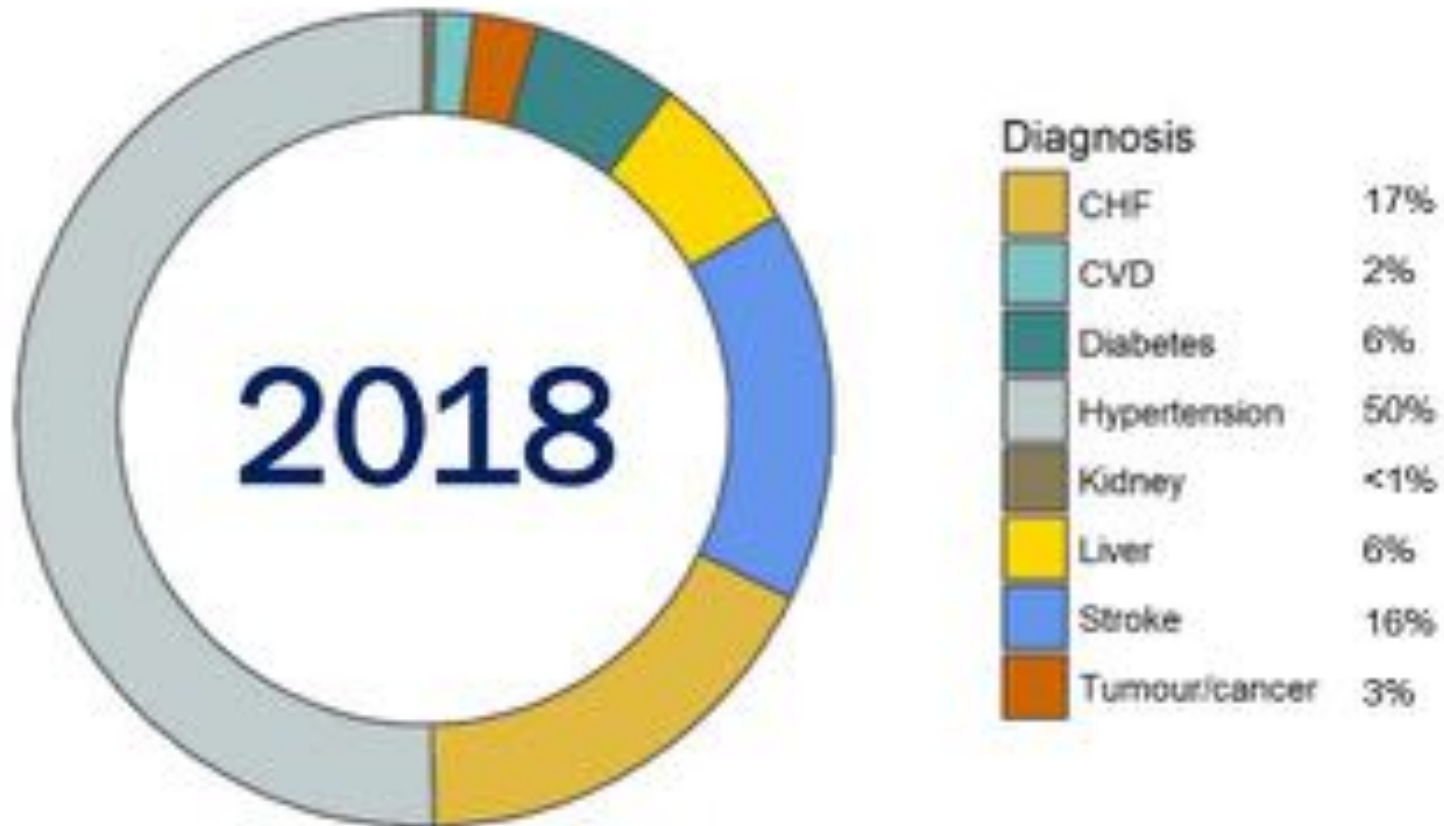
