What is the role of a facilitator?

- Ensures that everyone gets to participate and share ideas equally
- Helps keep the group conversation relevant and on topic
- Sets explicit community norms and ensures they are upheld during dialogue
- Summarizes and synthesizes comments when helpful to move the conversation forward
- Offers periodic time checks when necessary
- Probing further if someone says something others disagree with or doesn't make sense



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Other considerations

- Setting explicit community norms
- Calling out vs calling in
- Checking personal bias
