

Gender Resource Recommendations by Country

The Mental Health Program of Socios En Salud (the Peru-based office of PIH), with the financial support of Grand Challenges Canada, is introducing a gender strategy to assist sites in creating gender equitable mental health programming and help guide the work of implementers regarding the integration of a gender equality perspective and relevant GBV strategies. This initiative seeks to increase and improve mental health services and interventions, and to ensure gender awareness and knowledge in the services provided to communities. We found that each site's approach to gender equity differs depending on their national and regional policies, as well as PIH-site policies, resources, and personnel (e.g., some sites have GBV specialists whereas others did not) The outputs of Level 4: Country Specific Recommendations for Liberia, Lesotho, Mexico, and Peru are included in this document. This is a pilot project and reflects the first step in strengthening PIH's approach to integrating gender equity in its work around the world.

KEY OBJECTIVES:

- To inform and guide mental health implementers on how to best integrate gender equitable strategies in their programming via a 4-level framework (highlighted below)
- To inform and guide mental health implementers on how to prevent, treat, and properly address genderbased violence in their communities.



Level 1: International Framework

Provides a reference for actions and decisions of many international institutions. The International Framework also has a local reach and is nowadays a cross-cutting influence.



Level 2: Concepts, Definitions, and Theoretical Framework

International and multilateral organizations produce topic-specific information and knowledge, and obtain accurate data collected through implemented projects. They are trusted sources and, in many cases, provide guidelines to policies in a range of countries and international agreements.



Level 3: Recommendations and Gender Strategies

International and multilateral organizations, Global Think Tanks and International cooperation Agencies possess topic-specific information and documented experience regarding the projects they have implemented. Reviewing different gender related projects, the guides may provide innovative ideas to library users on the introduction and management of gender equality and GBV.



Level 4: Country Specific Recommendations


